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



4 BILLION without INTERNET




2 BILLION without MOBILE PHONES

Challenges in Education & Research

- Large gap in terms of Digital divide
- Inadequate flow of educational and research content to schools, colleges and universities,
- Not flexible in terms of location and schedule for both teacher and student
- Inadequate research activities and an underdeveloped research infrastructure,
- Limited interaction between academic and research community, industry and government,
- Limited regional cooperation and collaboration in sharing knowledge between researchers, teachers and educators
- Lack of technical expertise and visionary capability that has curtailed competitiveness of the country,



THE NREN – What is ?

- National Research and Education Network (NREN) is a not-for profit organisation providing advanced ICT services to the research and education communities.
- NRENs exist to enable efficient, reliable data communications and networking services for their nation's research and education communities.
- ➤ The ultimate purpose of an NREN is to serve scholars and innovators, ensuring that research and development is contributing to the local and global economy

To develop high-quality information and telecommunications infrastructure for the benefit of Sierra Leonean higher education and research institutions

Why SLREN?


- ➤ Catalyze the rapid deployment of a high speed general purpose digital communications infrastructure for Research & Education
- > Share technology services and resources among members
- Engage in national, regional and international collaboration in education and research
- ➤ Join a common culture and community for education and research organizations
- Engage in shaping legislation to in support the use of technology and networks in education and research

Fundamental Challenges

- ➤ Prohibitive cost of connectivity. Africa was paying in excess of US\$70 million annually for less that 1Gbps connectivity.
- Identify, provide and manage ICT services that enable and promote Research and Education. This has a wide spectrum of challenges ranging from infrastructure, collaboration to organizational management.

Funding Opportunities

- ➤ National World Bank Funding available to emerging NRENs
- ➤ GÉANT network that connects European NRENs internationally receives financial support from the European Commission e.g. Africa Connect 1 & 2
- ➤ Government contribution to the development of SLREN
- > Contributions from SLREN member community

Next Steps

- ➤ Stakeholder declaration for the establishment of SLREN
- ➤ Appoint interim Steering Committee and Management structure to oversee the establishment of SLREN
- > Register SLREN as a non profit making organisation
- ➤ Develop proposal and approach government and donor agencies for funding
