# LIBSENSE Nigeria Priority Areas

- Research Data Management (the process of organising, storing, preserving & sharing research data throughout its lifecycle)
- Diamond Open Access Publishing (scholarly publishing model where neither authors nor readers are charged fees)
- Research Assessment Reforms (moving beyond traditional metrics like impact factors and citation counts)
- Capacity Building (RDM tools, data management plans, open access publishing etc)
- Open Research Infrastructure (a lot of them e.g. institutional repositories, ORCID, WACREN open infrastructure etc.)
- Research Ethics & RDM Policy (research ethic guidelines, licensing options, National Data Protection Act, and other existing policies)
- Open Science Governance Structure (Who does what? How? When? Where? data stewardship)

#### Our Contributions at the National Level

The group in collaboration with the Association of University Librarians of Nigerian Universities (AULNU), Committee of Vice Chancellors in Nigerian Universities (CVC-NU), and the LIBSENSE Network of Experts have come out with several outputs:

- 1. A new common repository metadata schema
- 2. A call to action on assessment systems
- 3. Work plans and policy directions derived from a research data management (RDM) workshop
- 4. A national report on <u>Diamond Open Access journal</u> covering geopolitical zones in Nigeria We <u>presented</u> these outputs at priority-setting leadership engagement meetings in Lagos, Abuja,

Port Harcourt, and Ghana.



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


# Survey Results on Perception of Librarians on Open Science

2. Rate your level of awareness of the following aspects Open Science.




## Contributions at our various campuses

- 1. Establishing the Research Management Office headed by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research) and deployment of the Institutional Repository online through a series of engagements with the university stakeholders (**Lead City University**).
- 2. Increased awareness and number of researchers with persistent identifiers (ORCID) in our institutions (LASUSTECH, UNIJOS, ABU Zaria).
- 3. Capacity building for postgraduate students, librarians, and faculty staff on research data management, open access literature search, open access publishing routes, and use of open data repository and IR (**FUT Minna, Redeemers University, UNN, Ignatius Ajuru Uni**)
- 4. Stakeholder engagement on RDM and Research Ethics policy review and implementation (All universities).

# Call to Action!

How can I start the Open Science conversation on my campus?

#### **Call to Action!**

- Organize an Open Science awareness event: Host a seminar, panel discussion, or workshop to introduce the principles and benefits of Open Science to the campus community. Invite researchers, librarians, and university leadership to share their perspectives.
- Assess your campus's Open Science readiness: Survey to gauge the campus community's awareness.
- Collaborate with the library: Work with your campus library to showcase its resources and services that support Open Science, such as data and institutional repositories, openaccess publishing routes, funds and grants on open science.
- Leverage some LIBSENSE outputs for a start (e.g. metadata schema for Institutional Repositories, Open Science policy template) including emerging research assessment initiatives and issues (e.g. Declaration on Research Assessment (DORA), Retraction Watch etc.).
- Engage students and research groups on RDM best practices (undergraduate and postgraduate).
- Discuss incentivising research process and output with your management and stakeholders.

#### Conclusion

The key is to start small, build momentum and engage diverse stakeholders on your campus.

By fostering a culture of openness and collaboration, you can help advance Open Science and its benefits in your institution.
