





Academic Book Publishing



This is the production and dissemination of scholarly materials, including textbooks, research monographs, and reference texts, usually written by experts for an audience of students, researchers, and professionals.



Key features of academic book publishing include peer review, global reach, specialised content, and unlimited access to academic content to promote knowledge sharing.

The Open Access Publishing

Open-access (book) publishing is a model that allows scholarly books to be freely accessible to the public.

This means that anyone can read, download, and share the content without any cost or subscription barriers.

Open Access Publishing Models



Gold/APC-OA Publishing Model

Institutions, funders, researchers pay Article/Book Processing Charges (APC/BPC) to have research outputs openly published with commercial publishers.

Diamond/No-fee/Non-APC OA Publishing Model

Research-community driven and no APCs is paid by either the author or reader.

Green OA Publishing Model

Researchers do not pay APCs but can share pre-peer reviewed manuscript (pre-print). Researchers do not own the final copyright, and readers must pay to read the final published version.

OA Book Publishing: Debunking the MYTHS



The most common factor hindering the adoption of OA book publishing is the **cultural resistance and myths** about open-access publishing.

- OA books are not peer-reviewed (peer-review process is a major component of academic publishing)
- Open access publishing means the end of print (the need for coexistence with digital books due to users' preference, archival purposes or hybrid print-on-demand models)
- Open access leads to lower quality and prestige (more citations, more impact when it is open).

OA Book Publishing: Debunking the MYTHS



- All open-access journals/books charge APC/BPC (no charges to authors or readers in Diamond no-fee open access i.e., a community-driven publishing model)
- Open-access publishing is not sustainable (there are alternative sources of funding and sustainability e.g., the APC framework)
- Open-access publishing increases plagiarism (copyright and Creative Commons licenses applies).
